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FREN603 Title Research Seminar.

Number and type of credits 3 hours seminar.

Course Description Opportunity to apply research techniques to a specific topic of the student's

choice.

FREN604 Title Research Seminar Continuation.

Number and type of credits 1 hour seminar.

FREN604 Course Description This course allows students who have not completed the semester-long FREN 603

(Research Seminar) to finish it during additional semesters. May be repeated

up to a total of 4 credits.

FREN698 Title Master's Thesis.

Prerequisites Departmental approval.

Course Description Independent research project done under faculty advisement. Students must

follow the MSU Thesis Guidelines, which may be obtained from the Graduate School. Students should take FREN 699 if they don't complete FREN 698 within

the semester.

FREN699 Title Master's Thesis Extension.

Prerequisites FREN 698.

Course Description Continuation of Master's Thesis Project. Thesis Extension will be graded as

IP (in Progress) until thesis is completed, at which time a grade of Pass or

Fail will be given.

FRIN145 Title Introduction to French Culture.

Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture.

Course Description Various aspects of contemporary France such as politics, education, social and

artistic movements.

FRIN155 Title Introduction to French Literature Middle Ages to 18th Century.

Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture.

Course Description Study of major works and literary social movements of that period. Taught in

English.

FRIN156 Title Introduction To French Literature 19th And 20th Centuries.

Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture.

Course Description Study of major works and trends of that period. Taught in English.

Title FRIN186 Myths and Images of Women in French Literature. Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture. **Course Description** Literary treatments of female characters in representative works from the Middle Ages to the present. Taught in English. FRIN208 Title Mediterranean Civilization and the Origins of French Culture. **Prerequisites** FREN 132 or departmental approval. Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture. **Course Description** An examination of the origins and development of French culture in the fields of art, law, language, architecture, political systems, educational principles, and technology. Students will also explore the Roman roots of France, especially Southern France, the evolution of France towards its modern self, and the convergence of France and other former Roman enclaves in the European Union. Taught in English. Cross-listed with FREN 208. Students should register under FREN 208 to complete written work in French (French majors and minors), or under FRIN 208 to complete written work in English (non-French majors and minors). FRIN245 Title Napoleonic Wars Fact and Fiction. Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture. **Course Description** The historical novel as a genre; the relation of fiction to fact. FRIN260 Title Major Currents of Modern Thought in French Literature. **Prerequisites** GNHU 115 or GNHU 151 or GNHU 156 or FRIN 156 or ENWR 105 or HONP 100. Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture. **Course Description** Study of the dominant social, theological and aesthetic movements in French literature through selected works of prose and drama from the beginning of the century to the present. Taught in English. FRIN265 Title Modern French Theater. Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture. **Course Description** Study of the most significant plays of Claudel, Montherlant, Giraudoux, Sartre and Beckett and others. Taught in English. FRIN275 Title The Writer's Craft in French Literature. FRIN275 **Prerequisites** GNHU 115 or GNHU 151 or GNHU 156 or FRIN 156 or ENWR 105 or HONP 100. Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture.

Course Description Imagery in selected works of French prose and drama, as stylistic means for

the expression of an author's dominant ideas and attitudes.

FRIN283 Title Introduction to Women Authors of French-Speaking Africa.

Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture.

Course Description This course examines the representations of women in post-colonial literature

by French-speaking women authors from North and Sub-Saharan Africa (readings

in English translation). Students will explore major works of fiction by women authors as they relate to gender and cultural identity. Readings include novels that deal with contemporary socio-cultural issues. Meets the Gen Ed 2002 - Social Science, Non-Western Cultural Perspectives. Meets World

Cultures Requirement.

FRIN286 Title French Film.

Prerequisites GNHU 115 or GNHU 151 or FRIN 145 or FREN 132 or ENWR 105 or HONP 100.

Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture.

Course Description Development of film art with special emphasis on contemporary period. Taught

in English. Cross listed with Classics and General Humanities, GNHU 286, and

French, German and Russian, FREN 286.

FRIN287 Title Modern French Fiction.

Prerequisites GNHU 115 or GNHU 151 or GNHU 156 or FRIN 156 or ENWR 105 or HONP 100.

Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture.

Course Description Major novelistic modes from the writer-artist conceptions of Gide, through the

committed literature of Sartre and Camus, to Robbe-Grillet's new novel of the

50's.

FRIN288 Title Music and Art in French Civilization.

Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture.

Course Description Composers from the Middle Ages (Perotin) to modern times (Boulez) in relation

to their social and cultural backgrounds.

FRIN289 Title Francophone Film.

Prerequisites GNHU 115 or GNHU 151 or FRIN 145 or FREN 132 or ENWR 105 or HONP 100.

Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture.

Course Description This course will use cinema as a tool and medium for the critical analysis of

artistic and cultural discourse, and will introduce students to postcolonial Francophone cultures outside of metropolitan France and the western French-speaking world (Africa and the Caribbean). Taught in English. Cross

listed with French, German, and Russian FREN 289 and Classics and General Humanities, GNHU 289. Meets Gen Ed 2002 - Social Science, Non-Western

Cultural Perspectives. Meets World Cultures Requirement.

FRIN386 Title Development of French Novel to 1900.

Prerequisites GNHU 201 or GNHU 202 or FRIN 275 or GNHU 275.

Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture.

Course Description Evolution of fiction from the feminist writings of Mme. De Lafayette and

Diderot's literature of social involvement to the present.

FRIN390 Title Contemporary French Literature.

Prerequisites GNHU 201 or GNHU 202 or FRIN 287.

Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture.

Course Description Contemporary trends in French writing as revealed in selected works from

various genres.

GERM101 Title Beginning German I.

Special Fee Special fee.

Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture.

Course Description

For students without previous instruction in German. Emphasis on speaking, with practice in reading and writing simple German. Laboratory work. Meets

World Languages Requirement.

GERM110 Title Business German.

Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture.

Course Description The student will gain a basic insight into the culture, society and language

of commerce and industry of the German-speaking countries. Includes study of

the foreign cultural environment together with essential linguistic

background. No prior knowledge of German required.

GERM112 Title Beginning German II.

Special Fee Special fee.

Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture.

Course Description Emphasis on speaking, with practice in reading and writing German. Laboratory

work. Meets World Languages Requirement.

GERM115 Title Intensive Beginning German.

Number and type of credits 6 hours lecture.
