RELG492 Title Independent Study in Religion.

Prerequisites RELG 301 or RELG 332 or RELG 350 or RELG 352 or RELG 355 or RELG 357.

Starting Summer 2016: RELG 301, RELG 304, RELG 328, RELG 320, RELG 322, RELG 324, RELG 325, RELG 332, RELG 380, RELG 382, RELG 384 or RELG 386 may be taken

as prerequisite or corequisite.

Course Description Directed independent study and research in religious studies to students with

a minimum of 3.0 cumulative average in at least 9 semester hours of religion. May be repeated three times for a maximum of 12.0 credits. Starting Summer 2016: Directed independent study and research in religious studies. Open to students with a minimum of 3.0 cumulative average in at least 9 semester hours

of Religious Studies courses.

RUIN260 Title Selected Topics Related to Russian Culture and Civilization.

Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture.

Course Description Selected topics related to Russian Culture and Civilization. Topic announced

each semester. Taught in English. May be repeated twice for a maximum of nine credits. (If the topic is different.) Previous course GRIN 260 effective

through Winter 2013.

RUIN293 Title Russian Culture & Civilization.

Prerequisites GNHU 115 or GNHU 151 or ENWR 105 or HONP 100.

Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture.

Course Description The history of Russian culture from the early stages of Slavic civilization to

the contemporary post-Soviet Russian Federation. Special emphasis is placed

on the role of the arts, especially literature, as a reflection of

philosophical, political, and cultural change. No knowledge of Russian is

required. Cross listed with Classics and General Humanities, GNHU 293. Meets

Gen Ed 2002 - Social Science, Non-Western Cultural Perspectives.

RUIN294 Title Russian Prose & Drama.

Prerequisites GNHU 115 or GNHU 151 or ENWR 105 or HONP 100.

Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture.

Course Description Russian prose and drama from the 18th century to the present day.

Representative works: Pushkin, Gogol, Turgenev, Dostoevski, Tolstoi and Gorki.

No knowledge of Russian is required. Taught in English. Cross listed with

Classics and General Humanities, GNHU 294. Meets Gen Ed 2002 - Humanities,

World Literature or General Humanities.

RUIN297 Title Women in Russian Literature. **RUIN297 Course Description** This course will examine the roles, status, identity and problems of female characters in representative works of Russian literature from the medieval period to the present. It will trace the development of mythic images about "Mother Russia," study the cultural messages of classic nineteenth century Russian heroines and explore adaptations in the traditional appreciation of Russian women in the early Soviet period as well as contemporary works. Meets World Cultures Requirement. **RUSS101** Title Beginning Russian I. Special Fee Special fee. Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture. **Course Description** Fundamentals of grammar and pronunciation. Lab work. Meets World Languages Requirement. **RUSS112** Title Beginning Russian II. **Prerequisites RUSS 101.** Special fee. Special Fee Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture. **Course Description** The fundamentals of grammar and pronunciation. Laboratory work. Meets World Languages Requirement. Intermediate Russian I. RUSS121 Title Special Fee Special fee. Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture. **Course Description** Continuation of Russian 101 and 112; open to students who have acquired an elementary knowledge of Russian elsewhere. Detailed review of Russian grammar and pronunciation; more advanced conversation. Laboratory work. Meets World Languages Requirement. **RUSS132** Title Intermediate Russian II. Special Fee Special fee. Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture. Course Description Continuation of Russian 101 and 121. Open to students who have acquired an

elementary knowledge of Russian elsewhere. Detailed review of Russian grammar and pronunciation; more advanced conversation. Laboratory work. Meets World
