RUIN297	Course Description	This course will examine the roles, status, identity and problems of female characters in representative works of Russian literature from the medieval period to the present. It will trace the development of mythic images about "Mother Russia," study the cultural messages of classic nineteenth century Russian heroines and explore adaptations in the traditional appreciation of Russian women in the early Soviet period as well as contemporary works. various representative sites, tours, and lectures.

RUSS478 Title Independent Study in Russian.

RUSS478 Course Description Directed individual study and research in Russian for special students. May

be repeated without limit as long as the topic is different.

SASE210 Title Public Purposes of Education: Democracy and Schooling.

Prerequisites Sophomore level or higher and ENWR105 or HONP100.

Number and type of credits 3 hours lecture.

Course Description This course examines the public purposes of education in our social and

political democracy. Students inquire into the role of schools in fostering the development of democratic principles and practices and examine various
